

## **Curriculum Statement Overview**

At Wade Deacon Trust, our vision is for every pupil, in every school, to receive an exceptional education and a range of experiences which ensure that they can become rounded citizens, leading fulfilling, enjoyable lives.

- Is broad and balanced All pupils should have the opportunity to follow all subjects
  of the national curriculum across each key stage of learning, including PSHE. All
  pupils should be able to develop intellectually, creatively, socially and physically in
  high quality learning environments.



- Raises aspirations, provides enjoyment, builds confidence and self-esteem the curriculum should motivate all pupils to want to come to school, learn and be keen to succeed regardless of their personal, social and family circumstances.
